THROW IT OFF

HOW DO WE 'FORGET'

Overcoming our past is not a matter of denying it, it's a matter of disarming it. Our past has power over us when we a) walk in shame and condemnation for our failures or b) walk in unforgiveness and bitterness towards those who've failed us.

Our weapons to disarm both are 1) repentance and 2) forgiveness.

We can repent and forigve because Jesus

BECAME sin. He was tormented to the point of death to satisfy God's wrath against sin. There's no punishment left for you... or for those who've hurt you. Confessing your sin is the door to receiving forgiveness, and receiving forgivenenss gives power for releasing forgiveness. This disarms your past by laying it to death with Christ, and allowing new life to come... because the same power that raised Christ from the dead lives in you!

GOD'S KINGDOM IS BOTH NOW AND

NOT YET

For by one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy. -Hebrews 10:14 The Gospel is good news that Jesus **HAS SAVED US** from **THE PENALTY** of sin. This is our **JUSTIFICATION.** This means we are

declared righteous-holy and accepteable-before a Holy God. Just as if I never sinned. The Gospel is good news that Jesus **IS SAVING US** from **THE POWER** of sin. This is our **SANCTIFICATION.** This means we are in the

process of becoming more like Christ in our character and behavior as we yield to the Spirit at work in us.

The Gospel is good news that Jesus WILL SAVE US from THE PRESENCE of sin. This is our GLORIFICATION. This means he will return to remove all sin, restore all brokenness, and make all things new.

INTERPRET & APPLY

How does the promise of a future body, like Christ's resurrected body, influence your life in the interval between salvation and your physical death/resurrection?

CHRIST'S AMBASSADORS

Rome was led by power-hungry men who wanted to exploit their positions of authority and take over the world. We've already seen that Jesus is different, giving up his position to serve, obey, and even die for the salvation of His people. But Paul is actually borrowing, and redeeming, a term the Roman's used. "Ambassadors" were 'representatives" meant to bring the culture and authority of Rome to cities and villages like Philippi. As Christ's Ambassadors, we bring the culture of our place of citizenship--heaven--where God reconciles all things to himself. So as followers (disciples) of Jesus, we share the message of reconcilation so that other people can follow Jesus (discipleship). The more we KNOW Christ and what He's

done, the more we will want to MAKE HIM

KNOWN.

DISCIPLESHIP IS TRANSGENERATIONAL.

And the things **you** have heard **me** say... entrust to **reliable men** who will also be qualified to teach **others**. - 2 Timothy 2:2

PURSUE A PAUL. BE A BARNABAS. TRAIN A TIMOTHY.

CHAPTER THREE

At the end Ch. 3, we see a culmination of everything Paul has said so far. In Ch. 2, he lifts Jesus as the ultimate leader who offers rescue-not by exploiting his power and position, but by humbly serving. This is the mindset we also can, and should, have. Why? Because we are temples of the Spirit of God. If we let the Spirit of Jesus within us determine how we live, the world can catch a glimpse of what He's like.

From Ch. 3, we see that living a holy life won't

make us any more worthy of God's approval. We can only receive acceptance from God by relying on what HE has done. Does this mean we're perfect? Not yet! But we know God has put his Spirit in us as a deposit of what's coming. Does that mean it doesn't matter how we live? Nope. Heaven made its home in us! So we we live in our bodies as citizens of heaven and ambassadors to earth... bringing the culture of heaven everywhere we go. Our position with God isn't determined by how well or how poorly we represent him. But if we have a MIND like Christ, we will continue to grow in laying down our preferences, serving others, and walking in holiness.
